(beat, with quiet composure)

But it's not like a threat, threat. (MORE) (beat)

 (beat, genuine for the

first time)

Glenn is a sociopath. But, Henry doesn't have a crush on you, I mean, I don't think he does. He doesn't steal petty cash either. I don't know why I said that. I don't want it because it reminds me of my sister weirdly. And we don't talk because she hates me because I was a bad sister and I was always selfish. I still am, I guess. I hate looking at it. It makes me feel really alone and kind of ugly. I just wanted to get rid of it, but I can't. I get it. I'm sorry I threatened you. And I actually think you would do really, really well in Tokyo. You're a very considerate person and you're very quiet.

(beat)

I guess I'll just have to find someplace for her. Maybe on a library mantle, next to a gilded family portrait. I went in for a second. I didn't touch anything. Except for the lamp and the pillows. (beat)
